"Orrin Smith Maybee died 14 May 2003 at his home in Chico, California. He was born in Trenton, Hastings County, Ontario, Canada on 2 Feb 1917. He was the son of Harold Maybee and Addie Beatrice Smith. He was a descendant of Capt. Abraham Maybee who came to Canada in 1783 after the Revolutionary War."

"Orrin was the second son of Harold and Beatrice Maybee and grew up in Niagara Falls, New York. His brothers,

Theodore Harold and Reginald W. and his sister, Betty Jane, as well as his parents have preceded him in death."

"Orrin served 3 years in the C.C.C.'s, 5 years in the National Guard as well as 20 years in the Regular U.S. Army. He retired

31 August 1960 as a Major after graduating from OCS as a 2^{nd} LT. 6 June 1944. He served with the 263^{rd} Reg., 63^{rd} Division in Europe. After reenlisting as a Master Sgt. In December 1945 he was at the Presidio of San Francisco, California before taking his commission back in 1948. He was sent to Japan and when the Korean Conflict broke out he was sent there with the 7th Division. He was wounded and returned to Japan where his family was living. During his war duties, he received many awards including the Purple Heart, Bronze Star with two oak leaf clusters and many other decorations.

"Orrin was a member of the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars and Disabled American Veterans. He was also a member of Esplanade Baptist Church in Chico, (California).

"He is survived by his wife of nearly 60 years, Mona M. Maybee. Children: Mickey and Billy Hayes, Miki and Danny Martin, Melody and Fred Bryant and Mark and Dean Maybee, 17 grandchildren, 15 great grandchildren and two great-great grandchildren. His oldest daughter Mary Beth, passed away 14 April 2003. Service and burial will be at 2 p.m. at the Veteran's Honor Court in Glen Oak Cemetery

on Monday, May 19, 2003. A reception will follow the service at Esplanade Baptist Church, corner of Esplanade and 1st Avenue. Brusie Funeral Home is handling the arrangements."

UPDATE ON BAY OF QUINTE:

Rodney Green, #146, provided this updated information on the Bay of Quinte in Ontario. He is a librarian for the Marilyn Adams Genealogical Research Centre. He says, "the web site <<www.quinte.on.ca>> does contain a number of research locations. A few of the links either don't connect or the information is out of date. One has information from 1994.

"In this geographical area, there are over 50 locations for genealogical research alone. Many do not have web sites and the hours of operation vary greatly. Some are open in summer only, some on weekdays and some on weekends. Some have a treasure of one of a kind material. Small centres, run by volunteers with very limited funds, have difficulty getting the exposure they deserve. Adverti\$ing co\$t\$!"

"Tourist information centres and web sites like the one mentioned are oriented toward commercial enterprises such as Bed and Breakfast, arts and crafts, wineries, etc. They, like their counterparts in most locales, offer little to historians or genealogists. There are pleasant exceptions, but very few. One local tourist information office, in a city of 35,000, does not know where the public library or the historical society's prominent building is located, or, if in fact there is one. That was confirmed by a personal visit. I could see the library unobstructed from where I was standing!

"Volunteers often volunteer for more than one society. This overlapping gives a wideranging knowledge to each of the societies. The best references and directions to a genealogical research centre is from one to the other through their own network. I suggest joining an organization in the area of concern and depend on their knowledge of the area.

"The Marilyn Adams Genealogical Research Centre (MAGRC) is the only stand-alone genealogical research centre in Canada, and, is centrally located between Port Hope and Kingston. It is quickly becoming the largest in eastern Ontario.

"The MAGRC has a growing collection of records for the counties of Northumberland, Hastings. Prince Edward and Lennox & Addington. Because of the amount and variety of donations, there is also a large collection of material relating to other areas. A database is being compiled for the 1,000 plus genealogies, which are on the shelf. Many of these have Lovalist connections. This database guides the researcher quickly to a book and page for the name queried. For the above-mentioned counties, а cemetery database contains the stone inscriptions for the cemeteries, which have been recorded. Another valuable resource is the Hastings County land records. The abstract books are available as are the instruments for the period 1867-1955. The instruments prior to 1867 are located in the Archives of Ontario, "The MAGRC has volunteers who are knowledgeable in the genealogy, history and

geography of the area. Some of the volunteers are also members of the United Empire Loyalists, the LDS centre, and, other historical & genealogical societies. Most have Loyalist roots.

"Researchers can be quickly guided to the appropriate locations to either further their research or to occupy their extra days of research. The MAGRC is open on Monday and Tuesday, except holiday Mondays, and it is open on Wednesday in July and August. The web site for the MAGRC is <<www.guinte-kin.com>>.

"The MAGRC has a large collection of newsletters from genealogical and historical societies. I plan to add my complete collection of Maybee newsletters to the collection. Newsletters are not on the researchers "to read" list and it is a shame. There is a lot of information that can be gleaned from them."

HORTICULTURALLY HONORED

"Each year the Ontario Horticultural Association (OHA) the parent body for affiliated societies in the province seeks nominations for various awards for outstanding service to horticulture. One of its awards, the Trillium, has been given annually to a female society member since the early '50s; the equivalent award for men is the Silver Fir. Metje Mabee of Gananoque won last year's Trillium.

"Nominations from local horticultural societies must be submitted by February 28, and presentations are made at the association's annual convention, usually held in June. Nominees for the Trillium and

Silver Fir awards are judged on leadership in promoting their local society, public plantings they organized in their areas, or for longtime involvement in horticulture."

GARDENING AUTHOR:

Jym sent information about a book by author, Richard Mabey, called "Plants With A Purpose" (A guide to the everyday uses of wild plants.) The biographical notes say, "Richard Mabey, author and editor of educational books, broadcasts frequently on T.V. and radio and shares time between Hertfordshire and a cottage in Suffolk. He is the author of "Food For Free", "The Unofficial Countryside", "The Roadside Wildlife Book", "Street Flowers" and the "Pollution Handbook" and has edited an annotated edition of Gilbert White's "The Natural History of the Garden". 4) Jacob Perot bap. 12/29/1693 was mentioned in Jan's will, but not Martha's. He is definitely not the Jacob who married Marie Cousson. Marie and her husband were having children baptized as early as 6/12/1700 when Jacob was a child.
