Research Update

It seems like political news has been dominating the media, and not always for the better. So, I thought it might be a good idea to focus on three members of our family who successfully ventured into politics during the nineteenth century when (we like to think) things were more civil.

This is not to ignore the many family members who have served in various local elected offices, such as mayors and council persons. I myself was once elected to the local school board almost 40 years ago when we lived in northwest New Jersey. But that is not comparable to winning a seat in the state legislature.

The first successful politician in our family was Simon Mabee of the Town of Charleston who was elected in 1812 to the New York State Assembly as a representative for Montgomery County. Simon was the youngest son of John Mabee and Alida Toll. Simon's first wife was Gazina Visscher, the daughter of Colonel Frederick Visscher, a hero of the Battle of Oriskany. Gazina died in 1806 and Simon married Susanna Nexson Warner, the widow of George Warner in 1811. After serving his term of office, Simon and Susanna moved to New York City, living for a time in both Westchester County and in Connecticut.

Roughly 20 years later, Cornelius Mabee of the Town of Palatine was also elected to the New York State Legislature as a representative of Montgomery County. Cornelius was a son of Abraham Mabee and Anna Van Alstyne and he married Elizabeth Fox in 1812. He was a merchant in Palatine for almost 20 years when he was elected. Elizabeth died while Cornelius was serving in office and he married Maria Gross in 1839. Cornelius served several terms in the Legislature.

Henry Mabie of Patterson, NY, a son of Sylvester Mabie and Charlotte Hetherington, was the third member of our family to serve in the New York State Legislature. He married Maria Adrianna Ives in 1871 and was elected as a representative of Putnam County in 1885.

I also should recognize Charles R. Mabey who was elected the Governor of Utah in 1920. However, Charles was not a descendant of Pieter Casparszen van Naerden. Rather, Charles' parents emigrated from England in the 1860s.

On the lighter side, I was once prodded to run for a position in the student government while attending my Alma Mater, Midwestern State University, in Wichita Falls, TX. I agreed on the condition that the only campaign poster I would allow was one that read "Undecided? Vote Mabie". I won.

<u>The Upcoming Maybee</u> <u>Society Reunion</u>

As many of you know, the Maybee Society has been sponsoring a family reunion every 5 years at the Jan Mabee Farm in Rotterdam Junction, NY. The next reunion is scheduled to be held in 2020. While a date has not yet been selected, mid-July is the norm.

It is with sadness that I must inform you that, due to recent actions by the New York State Legislature and the Governor of New York that, as a personal form of protest, I will not again set foot in the State of New York until such time as their actions are reversed.
